WHEREAS, on April 13, 2022, at 7:00 p.m., the Town Board held a duly noticed public hearing on said application at Town Hall, 124 Main Street, Windsor, New York and all parties in attendance at said public hearing were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed franchise agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has used due diligence to investigate and assess the financial, legal and technical ability and character of the applicant, and to ascertain the operating record and reputation of the applicant; and

WHEREAS, the applicant’s plans for the continued operation of the cable television system were considered and found adequate and feasible by the Board to reasonably meet the future cable-related community needs and interests, taking into account the cost of meeting such needs and interests; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Windsor, duly convened in regular session, does hereby resolve as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby approves the cable television franchise of Adams in the Town of Windsor for a period of ten (10) years commencing on the date of approval by the Public Service Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board has determined that the authorization of the Franchise Agreement constitutes a Type II action under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act regulations at 6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(26) and (32) and therefore no further environmental review is necessary; and

WHEREAS, Linda Pierson lived her entire life in the Town of Windsor and served as the Town Historian for the past 2 years, sharing her love of local history with everyone. Her own family history in this valley is well-documented, going back to Benjamin Bird, one of the original settlers to arrive here in the 1780s. She is also a descendent of Eri Kent, an American Revolutionary War Veteran, for whom Kent Street was named; and

WHEREAS, prior to becoming the Town Historian, Linda would get inquiries from local residents about their own decedents. She took each inquiry seriously and devoted countless hours searching out answers for them; and

WHEREAS, when the History Room was established in 2009 at Windsor Town Hall, Linda was the first person to step up and become involved in the efforts to organize the room and open it up to the public. One of Linda’s goals was to bring more local history into the schools so our youth could better understand and appreciate the history of the place they call home; and

WHEREAS, under the name Historic Windsor Advisory Committee, Linda and the Committee spent countless hours putting together the Vintage Windsor Postcard Book, “Windsor on the Susquehanna.” Linda scanned hundreds of old postcards for use in the book to help create a visual collection of the Town’s rich history.
