The Board received the draft 2026 Tentative Budget, Council Member Colwell expressed his concern about not increasing fees in the sewer district since costs are always increasing and there will inevitably be repairs that are needed and they are always costly. Council Member Odell pointed out the notes that the budget officer had in the draft budget stating this fund continues to

draw from fund balance for regular operation. Supervisor Harting and Budget Officer Breeding explained that increasing sewer fees will not scratch the surface of what the bond payment will be in 7 years. Budget Officer Breeding shared that she has been looking into refinancing the bond but the way the current loan is structured it restricts the options.

Council Member Colwell asked for an explanation about paying off the 30-year bond for the Highway early. Budget Officer Breeding explained the Town will pay the principal and interest until 2031, the current amount in debt services is \$810,000.00 that was left over from the bond and there is \$741,000.00 in insurance money that was received later. Budget Officer Breeding explained the Town cannot prepay the bond, the left-over money is in debt services and at the end of this year the remaining insurance money can be rolled into that line as well. Currently the insurance money is in the Towns savings earning 4% interest and at the end of the year it can be determined how much will need to be put into that fund to pay off the loan in 7-years. Supervisor Harting stated that former Council Member Dan Price should be thanked for the Board looking into better interest rates at the bank which is helping in this situation.

Council Member Odell asked about the fund balance in the Fire budgets. Budget Officer Breeding, explained fund balance has been in those accounts but it should not be there, so increases in the fire budgets will be funded from that account.

Discussion: Council Member Odell asked Highway Superintendent Kithcart to explain what this was for, Superintendent Kithcart explained it is the anticipated cost to complete the road patching this year. Council Member Colwell asked why this was not part of the regular highway budget, Highway Superintendent Kithcart explained that this is for the extra patching the Town needs to do on roads that really need it and the money is available. Budget Officer Breeding explained that when the Town setup the fund balance accounts based on the adopted policy the current balance needs to be reduced. Council Member Colwell expressed that the Board should have input on the use of fund balance before it is decided to be spent. Council Member Colwell and Odell both stated they do not agree with the Comptroller's advice in regards to the Town's fund balance and voiced concern about not having funds in the future should something happen unexpected. Budget Officer Breeding explained that moving forward money to replenish fund balance will be built into the budget and the Town will keep it at the appropriate amount moving forward.

Discussion: Highway Superintendent Kithcart said they would like to pave the South end and East side of the Highway Garage paved as last winter it was very muddy. Council Member Colwell asked why funds were not coming from the left-over Highway Project funds, Budget Officer Breeding stated because it was not included in the original scope of work. Funds would come from the Capital Reserve fund for this and those funds will need to be replenished next year. Council Member Colwell voiced concern about getting this done before winter with having to hold a public hearing and that they may not be able to complete this. Superintendent Kithcart stated that in following the Town's procurement policy, if the Town purchases the material and rents the equipment, he will solicit the three necessary quotes for labor and the labor should be under the threshold where a public hearing will be required and the Board can just vote on the lowest quote in October.

The Board received the Town Clerks August 2025 Report, Clerk Pfister pointed out that the office had its largest amount of sporting licensing sales she has been in office. Clerk Pfister explained this is due to Dick's Sporting Goods no longer selling licenses and only some of the other municipal clerks in the area selling them.

Code Enforcement

The Board received the Code Officers August 2025 Report Osborne pointed out he issued 16 permits during the month. Code Officer Osborne mentioned that several residents have come in to get the Towns opinion on Auxiliary Dwelling Units (ADU's). NYS is currently pushing ADU's they are currently offering grants for people to build these units. The Town's zoning currently does not allow for more than one dwelling per tax parcel. Code Officer Osborne advised that a couple approached the Planning Board on this and Planning Chair Bennett is going to look into it, but Osborne advised Council Members may want to do some reading on these as well.

Code Officer Osborne mentioned he has been answering many phone calls with questions on the solar moratorium. Two employees from Abundant Solar have been attending Planning meetings and have offered to arrange a trip for Board members to view one of their operating solar projects. Code Officer Osborne shared these representatives have attended several Planning Board Meetings offering input on the local law as they have been working on it, Osborne believes a draft law will be to the Board by November. Code Officer Osborne asked Attorney Spinner if the Town would need file for an extension for the solar moratorium, Spinner advised that the need to file for an extension was written into the law so the Board will just need to pass a resolution at the next meeting to extend.

Dog Control

Supervisor Harting shared that former Coughlin & Gerhart Attorney, Gina Middleton who had been handling dangerous dog cases for the Town the past few years, she sent a draft proposal for her services as an independent attorney if the Town wanted to use her in the future to handle dangerous dog or code enforcement cases for the Town. Attorney Spinner is currently handling dangerous dog and code enforcement cases for the Town since Gina has left under the Town's contract with Coughlin & Gerhart and would be happy to continue to do so.
