Good morning.

I am writing requesting a change to the road name sign for E Bosket Road.

Unknown to the majority of the people in the area, E Bosket Road does not stand for "East" Bosket Road, but "Earl" Bosket Road, my great grandfather. Earl Bosket (1897-1957) was a farmer who inhabited this area of Windsor in the early 1900s. He owned a farm from this road to the banks of the Susquehanna River, before the land was divided by Route 17. However, for whatever reason, his entire first name is not on the sign, which has led to a wide misconception for the actual name of the road. I am requesting his entire name be added to the sign, because if left as is, there is a good chance that it's intended name will be lost. In fact, based on some conversations with a few people familiar with the area, I believe it already has been forgotten by almost everyone in the area. It takes just one current or future Town of Windsor employee to incorrectly assume the "E" means is "East" Bosket Road, changing the name on a future replaced sign, and the reason for the road name will be lost to history. Changing the E to "Earl" would simply eliminate any confusion.

Please let me know if the Town can make this change.
