Over the past couple of months, the history room has made some progress in digitizing records in the history room.

Resident Dave Markie scanned all the records pertaining to Windsor's Historic District which was placed on the National Register of Historic places in 1979.

Summer intern, Peighton Kruger scanned in and indexed all of the "*Echoes*" magazines that were in our collection from 1883 – 1914. These were publications that graduates of the Windsor Academy paid for subscriptions to, it shared news about other graduates and Windsor events annually.

Peighton also scanned in books in the historic collection: *Windsor Historic Essays*, *Windsor Post Card Book*, *Daniel Dickinson*, *Rebecca Kellogg Ashley*, *Windsor – "The Village with a Green"*, *Windsor Under Water 2006*.

Historic maps, town hall records about Dr. Isaac Edson, the Town Hall and the Theatre were digitized.

A gentleman came this summer and donated a box of Windsor post cards for the history room these have been digitized.

Peighton photographed the Hotchkiss quilt and the other historic displays in the history collection.

The list of names on the Hotchkiss quilt and the list of Historic Family files that are in the History room were all typed .

The records for the Indian Settlement at Onaquaga were being worked on when Peighton left and the One Room School House and Veterans information still need to be completed.

Looking into recommended long-term storage of the digital records but we now have all of this to utilize on the Town's website or wherever we want to use it.
