



Archaeological Dig of 1831 Hotchkiss House Land Topic of August 17 Historical Society Program

Windsor lost a valuable piece of its history when the Squire Frederick Hotchkiss House was taken down years ago. Being a historic site, the property was evaluated for artifacts by Archaeologist David Moyer of Gilbertsville, NY. David is the Old Onaquaga Historical Society's guest speaker Monday evening, August 17, at St. Luke's Church, 42 Maple Street, Harpursville, NY. His presentation starts at 7 pm.

David is currently Vice President of the New York State Archaeological Association (NYSAA). He is also a director of the Roland B. Hill Memorial Museum of Archaeology in Otego, NY, which is operated by the Upper Susquehanna Chapter of the NYSAA. He is the owner and principal investigator of Birchwood Archaeological Services, Inc., an archaeological consulting company located in Gilbertsville, NY. He presently serves on the board of directors for the Susquehanna River Archaeological Center (SRAC) in Waverly, NY and has written many archaeological reports, journal articles and conference papers.
